The Hudson & Holland Scholars Program is the largest scholarship support program at Indiana University. It is comprised of nearly 1,100 high achieving under-represented minority students who are without question, leaders and model citizens of the campus community. The mission of the Hudson & Holland Scholars Programs is to recruit, retain and prepare students with outstanding records of academic achievement, strong leadership experiences, and a commitment to social justice that add to the diversity of the student body on the Indiana University, Bloomington campus.

Here are a few amazing facts about Hudson & Holland Scholars:

- Of the 1,100 scholars, 85% have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher.
- The retention rate of scholars from the Freshman to Sophomore year is 98%
- 4-year Graduation rate is 74%
- 5-year Graduation rate is 86%
- Average GPA of the incoming freshman class was a 3.9
- Average SAT of the incoming freshman class was a 1250
- Average ACT of the incoming freshman class was a 27

Base Scholarship

- \$6,000 - four year renewable scholarships if student meets the requisite 3.0CGPA – 85% of scholars receive this amount of funding
- Students with 2.5 to 2.9 receive half scholarships of \$3,000 – 10% of scholars receive this funding
- Student below 2.5 receive no funding – 5% of scholars receive no funding support

Criteria for Scholarship

To be considered for the Hudson & Holland Scholars Program, students must:

- Complete a Hudson & Holland Scholars Program application;
- Possess a high school grade point average of 3.2 on a 4.0 scale, or the equivalent;
- Rank in the top 20% of their graduating high school class;
- Present a combined SAT Math and Verbal score of 1100 or higher, or an ACT score of 23

- Complete a balanced college preparatory curriculum;
- Possess a record of leadership or active participation in extracurricular or community service activities;
- Possess U.S. citizenship (or otherwise eligible for federal financial aid);
- Demonstrate a commitment to working with underrepresented/disadvantaged populations.
