Children will practice how to identify, talk about, and respond to feelings.

Families are encouraged to continue learning at home through books, conversation, and activities.

 **Conversation:** The night before school, talk with your child about what will happen when they arrive. Reassure your child that school is a safe and fun place.

 **Activities:** Help your child identify their feelings using posters, pictures, books, or magazines. Teach your child to say, "I feel _____."
